

Charlie is an Educational Support Dog, who will accompany Dottie in counselling sessions providing onsite therapeutic support and intervention for students and staff in classrooms and the playground.

Research suggests that therapy dogs have a measurable and positive impact on human wellbeing, particularly for students who may require additional support to address anxiety, behaviour and engagement. Animal Assisted therapy is beneficial when combined with traditional interventions for children with depression, anxiety, autism and stress management.
