Athletics Carnival Last Wednesday our students attended the newly refurbished Maitland Athletics Centre for our annual athletics carnival. Despite ominous weather warnings leading up to the day, the carnival took place under a blue sky and in picture perfect conditions. The format of this year's carnival was amended to ensure that all students were able to experience the world class track and field facilities on offer. Our students loved the opportunity, and this was reflected in the wonderful performances by our talented athletes on the day. It goes without saying that the carnival also featured outstanding behaviour, commitment and resilience by our students. Great work everyone!

NAIDOC Last Friday's NAIDOC celebration was an outstanding success. Members of our Junior AECG (Aboriginal Education Consultative Group), thoroughly planned the day and coordinated a broad range of tabloid activities for all students. We were also joined by MHS Aboriginal Education Officer, Chantal Tanna, and a group of students from Maitland High School who presented additional activities. The rotations enabled our students to experience traditional dance and cultural activities.

Education Week NSW State schools will be celebrating Education Week from next Monday, 1st August. Education Week is an annual celebration of NSW public education and the achievements of our students and schools. The theme of Education Week 2022 is 'Creating Futures - Education Changes Lives' and our school has lots of activities planned, including our NED Show program, public speaking, parent and teacher interviews and an open day for families.

NED Show Next Monday, day 1 of Education Week, our school will be presenting in class NED Show for students. This year, rather than a live in school performance, the program will be presented via a live stream. The NED Show (Never give up / Encourage others / Do your best) provides practical and age appropriate strategies to support positive behaviour and attitudes in young people. The presenter takes our students on an interactive and engaging journey filled with story telling, illusions, yo-yo tricks and humour! The NED Show has become a stable on our incursion calendar, and we are once again looking forward to the presentation.

Public Speaking Our Public speaking assembly will be held next Tuesday, day 2 of Education Week. A total of 22 students will present speeches on the day. Because of the large number of contestants, our speakers will be split over two assemblies, with Years 3-6 speaking during the morning session followed by our K-2 speakers from 12pm. To help choose the two students from each stage who will progress to the Maitland Zone competition, we have enlisted the expertise of external adjudicators to assist on the day.

Open Day We are inviting our parents and carers to join us on Friday of Education Week, 5th August. We have a number of activities planned on the day, including a brief whole school assembly, live performances, a combined Zumba activity and visits to classrooms, where every student in every class will receive a personalised Education Week certificate. The fun begins from 10am.

Reports and Parent Interviews Our student reports will be sent home this week. Parent/Teacher interview schedules have been sent home via Operoo profile, this will allow our parents/carers to select a time to meet with class teachers. If you are unable to come to the school, please be reminded that phone interviews are available as an alternate option.

Young Archies—Art Competition In recent years we introduced our Young Archies competition for our budding artists. In what was a great recognition for our school, our inaugural competition was judged by former Archibald Prize winner, Ben Quilty. We would like to once again invite our students to participate in this year's competition. Students are asked to create a portrait of a person known or of significance to them. Please be reminded that entries must be painted. We will distribute further information in the coming days.



Choose small screen games and Apps that reduce kids sitting time and encourage physical activity.


- Choose videos, games or Apps that get your kids moving e.g. dancing, sports, yoga. Join in using the App or game with your kids

Compulsory school attendance

Information for parents

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

What are my Legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age of 17 years. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with the NSW Education and Standards Authority for home schooling.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

The Importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- Ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- · Give students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption

Lateness is recorded as a partial absence and must be explained by parents.

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment.
- being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Principals may decline to accept an explanation that you have provided if they do not believe the absence is in the best interest of your child. In these circumstances your child's absence would be recorded as unjustified. When this happens the principal will discuss their decision with you and the reasons why.

Principals may request medical certificates or other documentation when frequent or long term absences are explained as being due to illness. Principals may also seek parental permission to speak with medical specialists to obtain information to collaboratively develop a health care plan to support your child. If the request is denied, the principal can record the absences as unjustified.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.

In some circumstances students may be eligible to enrol in distance education for travel periods over 50 school days. This should be discussed with your child's school principal.

My child won't go to school what should I do?

You should contact the principal as soon as possible to discuss the issue and ask for help. Strategies to help improve attendance may include a referral to the school's learning and support team or linking your child with appropriate support networks. The principal may seek further support from the Home School Liaison Program to develop an Attendance Improvement Plan.

What might happen if my child continues to have unacceptable absences?

It is important to understand that the Department of Education may be required to take further action where children of compulsory school age have recurring numbers of unexplained or unjustified absences from school. Some of the following actions may be undertaken:

Compulsory Schooling Conferences

You may be asked, along with your child, to attend a Compulsory Schooling Conference. The conference will help to identify the supports your child may need to have in place so they attend school regularly. The school, parents and agencies will work together to develop an agreed plan (known as Undertakings) to support your child's attendance at school.

 Application to the Children's Court – Compulsory Schooling Order

If your child's attendance at school remains unsatisfactory the Department may apply to the Children's Court for a Compulsory Schooling Order. The Children's Court magistrate may order a Compulsory Schooling Conference to be convened.

Prosecution in the Local Court

School and Department staff remain committed to working in partnership with you to address the issues which are preventing your child's full participation at school. In circumstances where a breach of compulsory schooling orders occurs further action may be taken against a parent in the Local Court. The result of court action can be the imposition of a community service order or a fine.

What age can my child leave school?

All New South Wales students must complete Year 10 or its equivalent. After Year 10, and up until they reach 17 years of age, there are a range of flexible options for students to complete their schooling.

Working in Partnership

The NSW Department of Education recognises that working collaboratively with students and their families is the best way to support the regular attendance of students at school.

We look forward to working in partnership with you to support your child to fulfil their life opportunities.


