## **Swimming Carnival**

We will schedule a swimming carnival assembly later in the term, where we will present students with ribbons and announce the name of our 2024 house champions.

When doing your child's enrolment there will be some information and documents that you will need on hand to complete the process.

- Centrelink CRNs for yourself and the child you are enrolling
- Credit card or bank account details for direct debit purposes
- Emergency contact details in case you are not contactable in an emergency
- Authorised nominees for drop off and collection
- Doctor, Medicare, immunisations details for your child
- 6 Any medical or health details for your child
